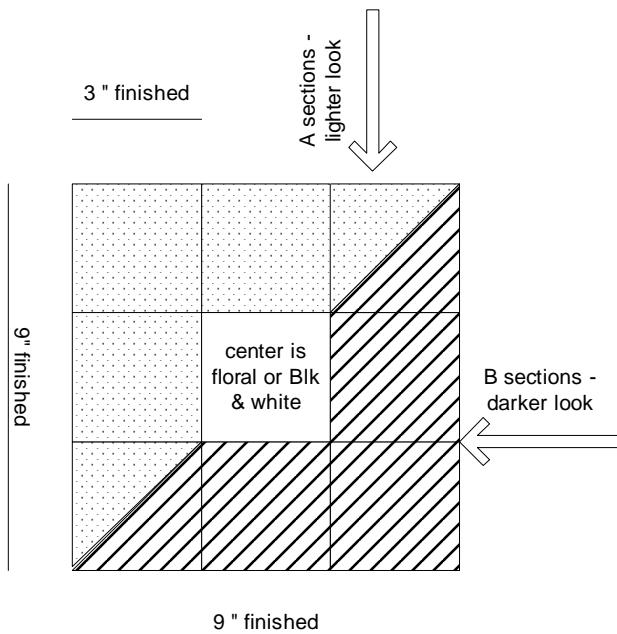


Split Nine Patch Block



Some fabrics have a wrong side that is as interesting and useful as the right side. This block explores that and creates a transparency effect by utilizing both the right and wrong sides of a single fabric.

Except for Center square, use ONE FABRIC, either a green fabric or a purple fabric, that has high contrast right side and wrong side. Whichever side is darker should be used for the bottom B sections of the block.

You will be using the right side of the fabric for half of the block and the wrong side of that same fabric for the other half of the block. Of that single fabric, cut as follows:

Cut 6 squares 3 1/2" size to make A sections. This will yield 3 for use of the right side of fabric and 3 for use with wrong side up.

Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" to make B sections. Cut corner to corner to yield 2 triangles for use of the right side of the fabric and 2 for use with wrong side up.

For Center Block, use either a black & white print or a floral. Cut 1 square 3 1/2" size.

Sew row pieces together and then sew rows together.

UNFINISHED block should square up to 9 1/2" x 9 1/2"
FINISHED blocks sewn together are 9" square.
